## Mini History of the Calder cenotaph:

- 1949 The stone cenotaph was first erected in front of Calder Hall
- November 11<sup>th</sup>, 1980 the stone cenotaph was relocated to Keyano Park on the southeast corner of Calder Seniors' Drop-In Centre.
- 1984 the stone cenotaph was on the move again; this time to the NW of the Seniors' Drop-In Centre

Thank you to Northwest Edmonton Seniors' Society (NWESS) for many years of hosting the Remembrance Day Celebration at their home, 12963 - 120 Street. Calder Community League and NWESS are now thrilled to say **"WE ARE ON THE MOVE AGAIN!"**

The Calder Cenotaph is moving back to its original location, north of the Calder Community Hall.

In 2017 Calder Community League worked to obtain Municipal Heritage Designation, the third such structure in Calder, forever saving the monument for our future generations. Moving this historical monument was not taken lightly and may seem odd for a heritage structure, but the monument is seen as a cultural heritage landscape as it has evolved with plaques and history over the last 70 years - so began the next steps. Discussion included talk of the NWESS wanting to expand their building, extending the parking lot and ultimately, the biggest concern, what happens to the cenotaph?

Kudos to Calder Community League, spearheaded by Civics Director Jesse Watson, to research funding for such an important part of Calder's history. The team was able to initiate a Parkland Change at Calder Park, which included 4 open houses, a neighbourhood survey, and website launch all to support an amazing park redevelopment. We'd like to thank the City of Edmonton, Veterans Canada, the Government of Alberta, Area One Council Society, the Last Post Fund, and many others who made saving this Cenotaph, at a cost of roughly \$300,000, possible. With their support, the legacy at the newly minted renamed Calder Memorial Park will live on!

Classes will start to run beginning of January to early February.


Skaters must bring their own skates and CSA approved helmets.




The Edmonton Neighbourhood Watch (ENW) Society's goal is to help empower communities to prevent crime. Two of the programs that we use to do this are the Neighbourhood Sign Program and the Door Sticker Program. Both of these programs operate very similarly: Residents who are willing to commit to practice crime prevention strategies and reporting suspicious behaviour to the police can sign up to receive an ENW door sticker for their home, and with enough support, we can have ENW signs put up in the neighbourhood as well.

The key to the success of programs like these is not the stickers or signs themselves, but the commitment made by those who sign up for them to watch out for our neighbours, and practice crime prevention strategies.

Crime prevention strategies aren't always costly or complicated. One simple way to help prevent crime is to practice what the Edmonton Police Service calls the "9 p.m. routine." Put simply, the 9 p.m. routine is simply getting into the habit of checking to ensure you've secured your property before going to bed. This means ensuring:

- Valuables and garage door openers are removed from vehicles
- Your car, garage, and house doors and windows are closed and locked
- No items of value are left out in the backyard
- You've brought in your mail
- Exterior lights are left on



Taking measures like these help make your home – and Kensington as a whole – less appealing for criminal activity.

### Sugar Cookies

*Adapted from a recipe originally published in Chatelaine Magazine December 2003 Makes approximately 5 dozen cookies, depending on cookie size.*

Ingredients:

5 to 5 ½ cups (1.25 to 1.375 L) all-purpose flour	2 tsp (10 mL) baking powder
1 ¼ cups (325 mL) margarine	2 ½ cups (625 mL) granulated sugar
4 eggs	4 tsp (20 mL) vanilla

1. In a large bowl measure 5 cups of flour and baking soda, mix together lightly with fork or whisk.
2. In another bowl using an electric mixer beat butter and sugar on medium-high until well mixed. Beat in eggs one at a time, scraping down sides as necessary. Mix in vanilla.
3. Gradually mix in flour just until mixed. If the dough is too sticky mix in the remaining ½ cup of flour, 2 tbsp at a time, only until dough is soft but not sticky.
4. Divide dough into 4 equal pieces. Form each into a ball, then wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate for at least 1 hour (dough can be refrigerated up to 3 days, or frozen for up to 1 month).
5. Pre-heat oven to 375°F (190°C). Lightly spray or oil baking sheets or line with parchment paper.
6. On a lightly floured surface, roll out the dough until no thicker than ¼ inch (0.5 cm). Cut out shapes. Place on baking sheet.
7. Bake in centre of preheated oven, rotating halfway through, until cookie edges are lightly golden, 8 to 10 minutes. Remove from oven and let sit on sheets for 1-2 minutes.
8. Remove cookies from sheet and allow to completely cool on a wire rack before storing in an airtight container, separating layers with wax paper, in a cool place or in the refrigerator for up to 2 weeks.

### Icing

Ingredients:

¼ cup margarine	½ kg icing sugar
Water by the tsp to desired consistency	1 tsp vanilla
Wilton icing colour	

1. Using a mixer, beat margarine until smooth.
2. Add icing sugar a little at a time and mix slowly until well combined.
3. Add water a few teaspoons at a time until desired consistency is reached.
4. Mix in vanilla.
5. Colour using Wilton icing colour until desired colour has been achieved.


